#### 2025 VESS WINTER MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

#### VASCULAR FELLOWS PROGRAM

In 2025, VESS hosted another successful Vascular Trainees Program, led by **Dr. Adam Doyle**. In preparation for the meeting, the 6-person organizing committee met several times to refine the program, building on past years' success. There was a focused effort to enhance the overall curriculum structure, while also introducing fresh perspectives with new speakers. Of the 11 talks, 8 were given by speakers who had not participated in previous years.

We saw an increase in the number of applicants, with 49 trainees applying (compared to 38 in 2024), including residents (0+5), fellows (5+2), and international participants from around the world. A total of 25 travel scholarships were awarded to applicants from 20 different training programs. Four attendees,

each from different programs, had the opportunity to present challenging endovascular and open cases, followed by engaging discussions.

The program featured excellent talks from 11 invited speakers, representing diverse institutions. Topics included "Tips and Tricks for Success," "Transitioning to Attending Life," and "Industry Relationships: Impact on Career and How to Develop/Maintain Them," with insights from 5 industry sponsors.


One highlight was the "Great Practice Debate," where trainees learned about various practice paradigms, and Vascular Jeopardy, a favorite activity, also made a return. To improve participation in the industry-sponsored lunch symposium and tech forum, attendance was made mandatory, and travel stipends were distributed at the conclusion of the tech forum. Overall, feedback from attendees was very positive.

We would like to extend our sincere thanks to our industry sponsors—Cook, Medtronic, Boston Scientific, and others—for their continued support of this valuable program.

#### 2025 TECHNOLOGY FORUM

The 2025 Technology Forum was an exceptional showcase of cutting edge technology utilized in the field of vascular surgery. The session was open to all, and was packed with Fellows, Residents, and many of our young career Vascular Surgeons. Forum attendees were able to get their hands on wet models, endovascular simulators, and the devices being used in advanced surgical suites and interventional rooms around the country. These ranged from demonstrating the efficacy of arterial lithotripsy courtesy of Shockwave Medical as well

as the latest suction thrombectomy from Penumbra, Inc. This year Cook Medical brought an updated aortic aneurysm repair simulator for



complex aneurysm repair. Terumo Aortic showcased their latest technologies and had their latest endograft devices on display for attendees to hold and examine ex-vivo. Johnson & amp; Johnson MedTech brought a wet model to demonstrate their newest procoagulants. Overall, the event was well attended and enjoyed by our attendees and industry partners.

#### **NEXT GENERATION STUDENT MENTOR PROGRAM**

The VESS hosted the 8th annual Next Generation Student Mentor Program in Breckinridge, CO on February 6th. The event was highly sought out by medical students around the country who are pursuing a career in vascular surgery, and those who wanted to gain more insight on what it is to be a vascular surgeon. We had over 60 applicants for the travel scholarship to attend. We welcomed 25 medical students from various levels, schools and backgrounds to our event. This wonderfully diverse group of Next Generation Scholars showed up ready to learn, mingle and participate in the discussions. The day started off with a warm and inspiring welcome address to the students by the president of the APDVS, **Dawn Coleman, MD**. We then started our panel discussions that were aimed at introducing students to the world of vascular surgery (and why we love it), as well as trying to give them helpful information on how to best navigate the journey to becoming one. Panels included topics



on "A Day In The Life Of A Vascular Surgeon", building a mentor/mentee relationship, inclusivity within our specialty and what we could be doing better, and a larger panel on what makes an applicant competitive.



We had surgeons from a variety of practice styles, different levels in their career and non-traditional backgrounds all sit on our panels to share their unique perspectives with the students. Students were incredibly receptive to all the discussions, which often had to be cut a little bit short! After the discussion, they headed to the convention hall in the afternoon for a skills session, run by committee members. Students were able to do an open lab where they were able to practice everything from knot tying to sewing an anastomosis with a 5-0. They also had a chance to practice obtaining ultrasound guided access and placing an EVAR and a TEVAR. Perhaps the best part about the skills session was seeing the medical students meeting and learning about each other and having a chance to speak more one-on-one with the committee members running the stations. Overall, it was a wonderful event that hopefully made a lasting impression on everyone who attended.

#### GENERAL SURGERY RESIDENT PROGRAM

We hosted the second General Surgery Resident Program at the winter VESS meeting this year in Sun Valley, ID. This program was attended by selected general surgery residents interested in vascular surgery from around the country. This year, we had more applicants than available slots and each attendee was provided a \$1000 travel stipend. Our program included new and previous speakers and panelists, who generously contributed their time and expertise to help our future vascular surgeons achieve their goals. We brought back popular discussions and presentations from last year, including talks on "What Makes A Competitive" Fellowship Applicant" as well as "Mentorship, Scholarships, and Research Opportunities". Our interactive panel discussions included a Fellows Panel, with 4 current and recently graduated fellows lending their experience to the group. We also brought back the popular "Great Debate: Academic vs. Private Practice", which sparked thoughtful and dynamic conversation. One of the most well received topics this year was a new talk on Financial Literacy, which was informative and incredibly useful to our young surgeons. In the afternoon, the residents participated in hands-on simulations of endovascular procedures for AAA and lower extremity revascularization, before participating in the Vascular Technology Forum. Overall, this was an incredible experience with a motivated and invested group of general surgery residents, poised to become the next leaders in our field. I want to thank all of the members of the General Surgery Resident Program committee and our speakers/panelists for making this year's program outstanding.

## VESS is proud to announce the inaugural year of the VESS Research Fellowship!

This is a 2-Year Research Fellowship for Vascular Surgery Integrated Residents and General Surgery Residents interested in Vascular Surgery who are planning to take dedicated research time starting in July of 2025!

The fellowship will include mentorship by the VESS Research Consortium members on a capstone, outcomes-based research study engaging with the VESS membership.

Along with this research opportunity, the fellowship will provide \$50,000 of funding each year to the recipient to support research efforts and scholastic endeavors.

#### **VESS MENTORSHIP PROGRAM**

Mentorship is one of the most important tools for professional development and has been linked to greater productivity, career advancement, and professional satisfaction.

The VESS Mentorship Program aims to promote career and leadership development for early career vascular surgeons. All Active members of the VESS within 10 years of training or candidate members in their last year of training are encouraged to apply.

Through a one-year young surgeon/leader match, the program will pair early career vascular surgeons with mentors who are more experienced colleagues, to provide opportunities to develop leadership skills and obtain guidance for achieving specific career goals.


